U.S. Junior & U.S. Girls' Junior Championships

The Saint Louis Chess Club is excited to host the greatest young minds during this championship series. Rounds will be held daily at 1 p.m. at the Saint Louis Chess Club and broadcast on uschesschamps.com. Selection for the tournament players is primarily based on the players' United States Chess Federation ratings. The 2018 U.S. Chess Championship field will consist of the 2017 U.S. Junior Champion, the 2017 Denker Champion, the 2017 U.S. Junior Open Champion, the top 6 rated players in the U.S. under 21, and 1 wildcard. The 2018 U.S. Girls' Junior Championship field will consist of the 2017 U.S. Girls' Junior Champion, the top 7 rated female players, and 1 wildcard. The winner of each section will then earn a spot in the respective 2019 U.S. Championship fields.

2018 Saint Louis Rapid & Blitz and the 2018 Sinquefield Cup

The Saint Louis Chess Club is excited to host these two elite tournaments. They are part of the Grand Chess Tour, which also includes stops in Leuven, Paris, and London with a total prize fund of over \$1 million. Each tournament will boast fields consisting of 10 of the highest rated players in the world, including 1 wildcard per event.
