



Grand Prix Rules for 2023 - 2024

Individual Standings:

The Grand Prix will be split into K-6 and K-12 divisions. Prizes will be awarded to the top 10 players in each division, as well as the top player from each grade. The Grand Prix placements will be decided by comparing points scored to games played to calculate a percentage score. In order to be eligible, players may miss no more than one tournament plus one game. With seven tournaments, this means that players must play 23 of 28 games. In the event of a tie, tiebreakers will be applied in this order:

- Most Games Played
- Total Wins (similar to points, but excluding draws)
- Highest Top Score
- Highest Quantity of Highest Top Score

In the event of a tie after these tiebreakers are applied, players will be declared co-winners.

Overall standings will be available at the end of the tournament schedule upon the announcement of the winners.

Team Standings:

The Grand Prix will be split into K-6 and K-12 divisions. Prizes will be awarded to the top 5 teams in each division. Team scores will be calculated by adding the top three scores from each team in each tournament. The winner will be determined by the highest total points. In the event of a tie, tiebreakers will be applied in this order:

- Total wins (similar to points, but excluding draws)
- Highest Top Score
- Highest Quantity of Highest Top Score
- Lowest Average ELO



Grand Prix Rules for 2023 - 2024

In the event of a tie after these tiebreakers are applied, teams will be declared co-winners.

Overall standings will be available after each tournament.
